

PREPARING FOR INJECTABLE FILLER AND/OR SCULPTRA

- Stop taking anticoagulant drugs, aspirin, ibuprofen (Motrin, Advil), naproxen sodium (Aleve, Naprosyn), meloxicam, diclofenac or other antiinflammatory medications, vitamin C & E, fish oils, omega 3 fatty acids, ginger tablets, garlic tablets, gingko tablets and herbal products for 1 week before and 1 week after the injections.
- 2. Tell Dr. Hugo or Pat Briggs, RN if you are taking cortisone tablets, immunosuppressant medicines or have a history of multiple severe allergies or anaphylaxis.
- 3. Cold sores can be activated by injections, especially near your lips. If you have a history of cold sores, inform Dr. Hugo so that he can discuss preventative medication. Call the office if you develop a cold sore or feel one developing before or after your injection.
- 4. You should postpone injectable filler treatment if you are experiencing any active inflammatory processes such as rashes, hives, pimples, or cold sores in or close to the injection area.
- Please do not wear lipstick, foundation, creams, lotions, perfumes or cologne on your entire face. Remove all eye make-up, eyeliner and mascara before treatment.
- 6. Please arrive promptly to your appointment to allow adequate time for numbing before your injection.
